- Expressing Feelings
- Expectations and Self-Worth

Participants will also learn how to use these assessment tools:

Adult-Adolescent Parenting Inventory (AAPI-2)

The AAPI-2 has proven invaluable in assessing parenting attitudes and child-rearing beliefs of parents and adolescents. Founded on five parenting constructs known to lead to abusive parenting, the AAPI-2 provides scores that profile parents at risk or abusing and neglecting children.

Nurturing Skills Competency Scale (NSCS)

The NSCS is a comprehensive criterions referenced measure designed to gather demographic data of the family, as well as knowledge and utilization of Nurturing Parenting® practices. The data generated from the pre/post administration allows parents and staff an opportunity to measure changes in family life, knowledge and utilization of Nurturing parenting practices.
